Thank you for having extended an offer of employment and caring about my background. All of my signatures on the court documents have been rescinded per Exhibit A and are thus void and have no power to be enforced including the bail bond document, thus eradicating the bail jumping claim.

The incident in Wisconsin is political in nature and involves what I considered bodily threats against me by members of the Sheriff's department. While in custody I was ordered to walk through a metal frame (alleged to be a metal detector), I asked "what if I don't?" then the officer said "I'll kick your ass" He was one of six armed officers around me. I advised them that I would comply but against my will. While in jail I observed people in life threatening situations due to clerical mistakes, improper maintenance of the building temperature.

I was advised by a legal researcher to leave the states . It was an eye opening experience to learn that law enforcement personnel lie on the record with an aim to gain conviction. On the day the trial was scheduled, I appeared yet the prosecutor's office wasn't ready for trial, they asked for an extension which I should have objected to at that moment which would have been grounds to have the case dismissed. I refused an offer of a small fine and a period of probation because I'm aware how they create larger issues out of missing probation appointments. I cannot see how this matter would interfere with any matters of trust in an IT role at Credit Sesame since this has nothing to do with theft.

Background

Some of you may recall the name Paul Ryan as a US Congressman who was a running mate to John McCain for President of the United States. Before Paul Ryan was chosen as a running mate I had decided to contend for his position in congress.

The attached newspaper articles tell of the incident although certain lies of the arresting sheriff are interesting to note:

1. My initial words to the officer were "Can I help you officer?" then.. "Am I doing anything wrong?" .
2. The officer did not warn me about being pepper sprayed, he just did it.
3. I was cooperative with being handcuffed.
4. I did not grab the officer nor was I aggressive toward him in any way as he alleges.
5. The deputy did not advise me that he did not have a taser as he said.
6. I never denied being Joe Baker.
7. I did ask "Why should I have to show you my drivers license?" As I wasn't driving at that time.
8. The deputy fabricated the part of the story about giving the wrong name.

9. The license plates were expired by less than a month and no citation was given for this.
10. I did not jam my hands behind the sandwich board.
11. I showed the officer my drivers license as he had asked me to show it to him.
12. The officer never asked how I had gotten there.
13. The officer never told me I was under arrest.
14. I never jerked the license away. I held it in position firmly in front of me so the officer could see it.
15. There was only one exchange about the drivers license. The officer likes to invent the idea that things happen three times to make himself seem reasonable.
16. The officer lies about trying to pull away from him during hand cuffing.
17. The officer lies about me trying to bury my head in his chest.
18. At no time did I grab at the officer's uniform.
19. The Sheriff tried to trip me.
20. The sheriff flew into a tantrum of insane violence and was trying to rip my strongly secured sandwich sign off my body if he were on some psychotropic drugs while I was kneeling trying to be helpful even in the arrest.
21. The sheriff talks of me "breaking free" yet, I never broke free.
22. The sheriff says nothing about how he tried to trip me. My training in wrestling in middle school prohibited him from being able to trip me moving my legs, knowing how to balance.
23. The officer sprayed pepper spray in my face when I was kneeling down already surrendered.
24. The officer lied saying he told me to stop resisting. I never resisted arrest once he caught up to me. (I did run for my life thinking I might die from being tazed as had happened to about 100 people already) I only resisted falling from being tripped.
25. The officer gets the chronology wrong saying I said "don't tazer me" at the end of the incident, when in fact it happened at the very beginning when he realized I wasn't handing him the drivers license, rather firmly holding it towards him firmly so he could see it as he requested to "see it". This was when he became enraged and fumbled trying to get something from the right side of his belt which I believed to be a tazer. I said "don't taze me" and waited for three seconds hearing no verbal response, I dashed off clumsily in a large sandwich sign at a slow pace trying to save my life.
26. I did not scream while running as the Sheriff states.
27. I did not run after being pepper sprayed as the sheriff states.

6. On Tuesday, the-thirteenth-day of the-fifth-month two-thousand-eight a public defender notification document.
7. On Monday, the-second-day of the-sixth-month two-thousand-eight a modified bond document citing 2008CM001050.
8. On Monday, the-second-day of the-third-month of the year two-thousand-nine a property receipt after arrest.
9. On Monday, the-second-day of the-third-month two-thousand-nine a fingerprint document.

10. On Friday, the-sixth-day of the-third-month two-thousand-nine a bond document referencing an identification number 2009CM000542.
11. On Friday, the-sixth-day of the-third-month two-thousand-nine a bond document bearing an identification number 2008CM001050 and erroneously bearing a date of Tuesday, the-third-day of the-third-month two-thousand-nine.
12. I had no choice I was threatened with false imprisonment, I was assaulted and battered, felt threatened with a taser, aware of death of others by taser.
13. Coercion started when the officer reached for his weapon on his belt, False Arrest, False imprisonment, assault & battery, excessive force, etc.

Signs point to an election

Local man's happy message precedes his campaign

With a smile, a hearty wave and a stenciled sign bidding all who pass to "Have a nice day!" Joseph Baker says he was just trying to inject a little bit of sunshine into an otherwise gloomy Friday morning.

And judging by the response of the drivers zipping past Baker's post in the 900 block of Milwaukee Avenue May 2, he had accomplished his goal. Many returned his wave, some honked in approval and two even took the time to call the local newspaper to express their appreciation for the unexpected pick-me-up.

"My waves and smiles are genuine," Baker said, shortly after letting it be known that he's also planning to run as a write-in candidate against incumbent Paul Ryan in next fall's election for Wisconsin's 1st Congressional District seat.

"If we can get people in a better mood,

they're going to think more creatively today," Baker said. "I could stand here with 50 to 100 signs about what's wrong with the world, but I've come to the conclusion a positive message will have a greater impact."

While only Baker knows whether his "Have a nice day" campaign was part of a larger effort to raise his profile as a candidate, it's no secret the Burlington resident isn't shy about thrusting himself into the public eye for causes he believes in.

In February Baker was seen around the area actively campaigning for Republican presidential candidate Ron Paul. On April 15, Baker could be found in front of the Burlington Post Office protesting the income tax. At the time he boldly admitted to a reporter that he hadn't filed a tax return since 1998.

While most people with such a tax record would prefer to keep a low profile, Baker prefers to take a stand.

"I was asleep politically until Ron Paul woke me up," he said, noting that his status as a congressional candidate will give him a chance to address the state Republican Convention May 17 and 18.

Baker said he's out to prove to people that a candidate can win on a shoestring budget. "It's going to be as near to \$0 as I can make it," he said.

By his own count, Baker has run for a variety of local, state and federal office five times — as a Republican and a "conservative" Democrat. He also ran for Congress in 1992 against current City of Milwaukee Mayor Tom Barrett, who then represented the Milwaukee area in Washington.

Baker is running as a write-in because he questions the reliability of vote-tabulating machines and wants make sure each of his votes are counted by hand.

He also wants people to know that the process is not as difficult as it may seem.

"Just write in Joseph William Baker," he said.

But Baker never got a chance to wave goodbye when the party faithful left.

By the time the fund-raiser ended, Baker had been arrested on several misdemeanors, sprayed in the face with a chemical disabler and escorted to the Racine County Jail, where he stayed for several hours until his wife arranged for payment of a \$500 signature bond.

Shaken by the experience and concerned about the serious nature of the charges against him, Baker argues that his arrest was unreasonable if not unlawful. He said he can't afford to pay a lawyer to argue his case, and said his efforts to speak with Racine County Sheriff Robert Carlson about the incident have been ignored.

Monday night, Baker said he disputes some of the information contained in the complaint written up against him, and even wonders if parts of it were made up to give the sheriff's department a cover story for actions taken that evening.

Baker is a card-carrying

member of the Racine County Republican Party, currently running a low-cost write-in campaign against Ryan.

He is using signs painted with a simple "Have a nice day!" slogan to gain public awareness.

Baker said this kind of peaceful, grassroots effort has a long and successful tradition in Wisconsin, and noted that both former Sen. William Proxmire and Rep. Les Aspin used signs as a strategy early in their political careers.

Baker said he wonders if last week's incident developed because party big wigs were unhappy with his presence outside the Ryan fund-raiser and worried about the effectiveness of his campaign against Ryan.

Baker said he regrets that no video of the incident was recorded by the sheriff's department.

He also regrets not equipping himself with an audio recorder that could have bolstered his version of the events that took place May 12.

Baker said he did not give the sheriff's department deputy who approached him a false name or touch the deputy, as reported.

"I do not recall at all grabbing at the officer's clothes," Baker said. "He did try to trip me and all I did was try to keep my balance."

Baker admits he did refuse to hand over his driver's license to the sheriff's deputy, but said he believes there was no probable cause for him to be asked for identification.

"The point is we are not in a country where you have to show your papers wherever you go," Baker said.

According to the case detail report, a sheriff's deputy observed Baker's vehicle stopped on the north side of Highway 164 with its hazard flashing lights on.

The deputy approached Baker, who was standing nearby with his sign, to check on Baker's welfare. Baker reportedly explained he was running for Congress, and the deputy left after wishing him good luck in his bid for office.

The deputy was ordered back to the area soon after when dispatch advised that Baker's vehicle registration plate was expired.

The deputy was also asked to ID the person walking with the signboard, since someone with a signboard had been in the area a couple of days earlier, causing problems.

That person "had gone missing" and police had not been

able to identify him, according to the report.

Baker questions the validity of the missing second signboard, and said he only stood with his signboard near Runzheimer May 12.

Baker said he has asked the sheriff's department for written evidence of the earlier disturbance, and is concerned about the possibility of a frame-up.

Baker said he feared he was

in danger of being "tased," or hit by a device similar to a stun gun May 12. Instead, the deputy reportedly shot pepper spray into Baker's face after warning Baker he would be sprayed if he did not cooperate with getting handcuffed.

After the spraying, Baker ran down the side of the highway screaming in pain.

He was then handcuffed and taken into custody without fur-

ther incident, and charged with disorderly conduct and resisting/obstructing an officer.

Meanwhile, Baker's plans for this weekend are uncertain.

He said he had hoped to walk the grounds of ChocolateFest with his "nice day" campaign message, but is concerned that could be seen as a violation of his bond conditions.

Baker said he is asking the court for clarification.

bid, the deputy left Baker to respond to another call.

The deputy returned to Baker a short while later after learning from a dispatcher that the plates on his vehicle were expired.

When the deputy asked Baker for his driver's license, the report states that Baker denied being Joe Baker, but rather called himself "Thomas Baker" and began walking away from the deputy.

Asked again for his license, Baker allegedly told the deputy he wasn't required to show him it and jammed his hands behind the sandwich board.

Ordered three additional times to reveal his license, Baker continued to refuse, claiming the deputy had no right to see it.

Upon the deputy informing Baker the plates on his car were expired, Baker reportedly denied driving the vehicle to the scene. He finally acknowledged he was behind the wheel of it when the deputy asked how it had gotten there.

After again being ordered

to turn over his license to the deputy, the report states that Baker held it out but quickly jerked it away when the deputy went to reach for it. Holding it around three feet away from the deputy, Baker reportedly told him he could only look at it. The back and forth exchange took place two more times, according to the deputy, before he told Baker he was under arrest.

It was at that point, the report states, that Baker refused to place his hands behind his back and tried to pull away from the deputy upon attempts to handcuff him.

Breaking free, the report notes that at one point Baker stepped toward the deputy and attempted to bury his head in the his chest or grab at his uniform.

In an attempt to get Baker under control so he could be restrained, the deputy reportedly pushed Baker off of him and pulled out his pepper spray canister and ordered Baker to stop resisting.

Baker then reportedly placed his hands behind his back and shouted, "don't Taser me."

After telling Baker it was pepper spray and not a Taser, the deputy said Baker once again charged at him and attempted to grab his shirt. Squirting him with a short burst of pepper spray, the deputy documented that Baker started screaming and running along Highway 164. The deputy then caught up with him and took him into custody.

It was during the ride in the squad car en route to the Racine County Jail when the deputy said Baker began laughing and stated that he would have given \$1,000 to see himself on video, running around with the sandwich board after having been sprayed.

He was subsequently released on a \$500 signature bond pending resolution of the charges.

All three counts are misdemeanors. The two resisting/obstructing an officer counts are Class A violations while the disorderly conduct falls into the Class B category.

Baker gained local notoriety back in April, when he crafted some signs urging people not to file their taxes. He then stood outside the Burlington Post Office with signs in tow on the tax-filing deadline, hoping to convince others to refuse filing a tax return as he has.

A few weeks later Baker made news again by announcing that he would challenge U.S. Rep. Paul Ryan as a write-in Republican candidate.

This week he accused the Republican party of violating his free speech, after he was shut out from speaking at this year's state party convention in Stevens Point.

In a press release, Baker said he intended to speak to delegates to urge them to abstain from voting in the first two rounds and use the third to vote for Ron
